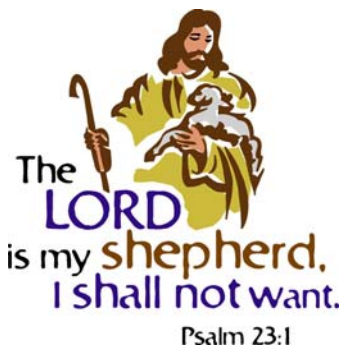

Worship and Music : Michelle had written report-- most of the discussion at meeting centered around safety for the church ushers have been walking around during service. Speaker needs to be fixed in the fellowship Hall so ushers could hear service.

Fellowship committee: Carol reported silent auction and covered dish planned for 5th Sunday all proceeds will go to ELCA Services for the Aging Mother's day flowers were given to all mothers and 2 special mom's were recognized.

Property committee : Chip reports bleachers are installed look great We hope organ fixed for good.

Social Ministry: Bob reports peaches will be delivered we supply 130 cans per month

Finance Committee: No report

Unfinished Business:

1. Handbells how to repair and how to pay for After much discussion and research on past expenditures funded by this fund a motion was made by Chip to give authority to Worship and Music Committee to decide how best to repair bells and they are authorized to spend up to 1000.00 Money coming from the Special Projects Funds and Building replacement /remodeling Fund . Wendy made the second. All voted in favor.

2. Nursery: This is the end of the 3 month trial and after much discussion ie how many children was served Neil made the Motion to do away with the paid attendant on Sunday, the end day being May 29th Bob made the second all voted in favor. It was made mention a call for volunteers to man the nursery would need to be made. The paid attendant will remain for the AWE service on Wednesday night. More research will be done on Children's services and how better to serve the children of this church and how to welcome new families with children in the future.

3. Playground Equipment- Wendy reported that the paperwork is done and now a place to put the playground will need to be decided. More research is needed and will be decided in near future.

4. Synod delegates. Michelle and Brian have volunteered to go.

New Business:

1. There was a letter signed by all the Prime time Sunday School Class requesting attendance and offering information be put in the bulletin every Sunday. It was decided to post on both bulletin boards the attendance and the offering information so easy access to the information could be had by all..

2. Lohr Scholarship Memorial.—A letter was sent from New Bridge Bank stating the trusteeship has been dissolved and a check has been sent for 12,529.00. It was made note that the council feels the wishes of the Lohr family be kept and only the interest be used for scholarships. After discussion the council decided to give the money to the scholarship committee and have them look into where to invest the money for the best return and a request to the committee to look into Thrivent investments.

3. Phone Tree Extra Help It was suggested Caroline needs a back up for the phone tree Chip said he had volunteered along time ago and would like to do it. The council gave their blessings for Chip to get with Caroline to learn how to do it.

4. The nominating committee will need to be formed in the next 2 months to begin the process for finding new council members. All will think and pray about it until next meeting.

5. Dean reported Sharon Everhart wants to do a Thrivent event She wants to have a movie night on June 4th It was decided she should go ahead with council's endorsement.

6. It was decided to change the basket offering for June to Habitat for Humanity. Carol made the motion and Chip second all voted in favor.

With no other business the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Dear friends in Christ,

Do you remember the story of the temptation of Jesus in the wilderness. the devil tempted Jesus to turn stones into bread, to throw himself down from the temple to force God to save him, and to worship the devil in exchange for all the kingdoms of this world. Jesus was tempted to turn away from God. Read the story in Matthew 4:1-11.

The most interesting and challenging part of the story as I read it today is the very first verse which says that the Spirit led Jesus into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. Isn't that amazing? We pray to our Father in heaven to lead us *not* into temptation, but in Matthew 4 we discover that the Spirit led Jesus into a barren, dry place to be tempted. The verse challenges us to think about some important questions for those times in our lives when things are not going well.

- Could it be possible that God leads us into dry, desolate, hopeless places and remains with us to do something good in our lives?
- Is it possible that there are things that you could learn in the wilderness, things that you could only learn in the wilderness? Could it be possible that God has a gift of grace for you in whatever wilderness you experience?

We all find ourselves in desert places at times. We fight against those experiences, struggle to get out, complain about them, and may even see ourselves as victims. I think about a young mother, divorced from an alcoholic man who does not provide the court-appointed child support. She is being evicted from her apartment. Her children don't want to move away to a better place and are thinking about staying with the alcoholic dad. Now, that woman is going through a wilderness! What do you think? Is it possible that God is leading that woman through the wilderness into a new life? I believe that is exactly what is going on. Furthermore, it may not have been possible for that woman to come to the newness of life that she needs unless she went through the wilderness.

God never forsakes us. God didn't forsake Jesus at the cross, even though Jesus felt like he was forsaken. God doesn't forsake us at our crosses either. I believe what the scripture says when it makes the claim that God is able to work God in all circumstances in our lives.

We are living in tough times. Natural disasters abound. Economic challenges persist. Time pressures bring stress. People bring negativity to church communities that is unattractive. Concern about the future paralyzes some. In the midst of all these wilderness experiences, and others like them, God is present to bring us through to the places of "milk and honey" where we can be a blessing as God intends us to be.

In the wilderness, we can learn a couple of vital lessons. First of all, we can learn to trust God more than ever. We can learn to love the Lord our God with everything we've got. What a great lesson to learn!

Secondly, in the wilderness, as we experience pain and agony there, God can create within us a greater sense of empathy and compassion for the struggles that people experience. A deeper capacity for compassion gives us a life more full, more abundant. What a great lesson to learn!

God be with you, to lead you to love the Lord with all your heart and soul and mind and strength, and to love others as you love yourself.

MEANING OF THE FLAG DRAPED COFFIN

A lesson.

Those who think that America is an arrogant nation should really reconsider. Our founding fathers used God's word and teachings to establish our Great Nation and I think it's high time Americans get re-educated about this Nations history.

Be proud of the country we live in and even more proud of those who served and serve to protect our "God Given" rights and freedom.

Take time to read..... to understand what the flag draped coffin really means.... here is how to understand the flag that laid upon it and is surrendered to so many widows and widowers.

Did you know that at military funerals, the 21-gun salute stands for the sum of numbers in the year 1776 ?

Have to you noticed the honor guard pays meticulous attention to correctly folding the United States of America Flag 13 times ? You probably thought is was to symbolize the original 13 colonies, but we all learn something new every day !

The 1st fold is a symbol of life.

The 2nd fold is a symbol of the belief in eternal life.

The 3rd fold is in honor and remembrance of the veterans departing the ranks who gave a portion of their lives for the defense of the country to attain peace through- out the world.

The 4th fold represents the weaker nature, for as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace as well as in the time of war for His divine guidance.

The 5th fold is a tribute to the country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our Country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right; but it is still our country, right wrong".

The 6th fold is for where people's hearts lie. It is with their heart that they pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.

The 7th fold is a tribute to the Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that they protect their country and their flag against all her enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of their republic.

The 8th fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day.

The 9th fold is a tribute to womanhood and mothers. For it has been through their faith, their love, loyalty and devotions that the character of the men and women who have made this country great has been molded.

The 10th fold is a tribute to the father, for he too has given his sons and daughters for the defense of their country since they were first born.

The 13th fold, or when the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost reminding them of their Nations motto, "In God We Trust".

After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the Soldiers who served under General George Washington, and the Sailors and Marines who served under Captain John Paul

Jones, who were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States, preserving for them the rights, privileges and freedoms they enjoy today.

There are some traditions and ways of doing things that have deep meaning.

In the future when you see the draped coffin and folding of the flag you will know why. Share this the chil-

How to observe Memorial Day!

"...gather around their sacred remains and garland the passionless mounds above them with choicest flowers of springtime....let us in this solemn presence renew our pledges to aid and assist those whom they have left among us as sacred charges upon the Nation's gratitude,--the soldier's and sailor's widow and orphan." --General John Logan, General Order No. 11, 5 May 1868



This is a day where we actively remember our ancestors, our family members, our loved ones, our neighbors, and our friends who have given the ultimate sacrifice:

- by visiting cemeteries and placing flags or flowers on the graves of our fallen heroes.
- by visiting memorials.
- by flying the U.S. Flag at half-staff until noon.
- by flying the 'POW/MIA Flag' as well (Section 1082 of the 1998 Defense Authorization Act).
- by participating in a "[National Moment of Remembrance](#)": at 3 p.m. to pause and think upon the true meaning of the day, and for [Taps](#) to be played.
- by renewing a pledge to aid the widows, widowers, and orphans of our fallen dead, and to aid the disabled veterans.

Memorial Day is just one day out of the year to honor our loved ones, our ancestors, our friends who died in conflicts and wars —not to honor war, but to honor those who died in those conflicts and wars.



Passionate Spirituality

The greatest opportunity at Holly Grove Lutheran Church for health and growth, as a congregation and as individuals, is currently in the area of passionate spirituality.

What is passionate spirituality? A simple way to think of passionate spirituality is in terms of how much you value your relationship with God. Two people who are passionately in love spend quality time together, they talk and listen a lot, what the other wants and needs is of great concern, they think about the other person even when they are not together, and they talk to their friends about their partner.

How much time do you spend in conversation with God in prayer, both speaking and listening? How much does your relationship with God influence the things you do and say on a daily basis? The people who spoke through our most recent survey indicate that we can grow significantly as a congregation if each one of us spends more time with God in prayer and reading the scripture, and if each one of us learns how to tell others about the difference God makes in our lives.

A challenge for you! Set your mind to prayer a bit more often that you do now - how about 5 more minutes a day? Set your mind to read the Bible a bit more often that you do now - maybe 5 more minutes a day. If you are too busy to do pray or read the Bible more, ask yourself if you are too busy! Notice what happens when you choose to dedicate a few more moments to the Lord God who cherishes the time with you.
