Approval of Reports

Minutes of the December, 2019 meeting were read. Chip moved to accept, Eddie seconded and motion approved Financial report was presented. Max moved to accept, Mike seconded and motion approved. New Business:

Judy Black, representing the Worship and Music Committee, was present to discuss the ongoing problems we are having with the organ. The recommendation from Morris Spearman, the technician who has been trying to keep our organ in operation, is to replace the organ control system rather than continue spending the money to patch and repair. A quote of \$10,000.00 was given for this work. Chip made the motion to replace the organ control system and that the funds come out of the general fund, Max seconded and motion was approved. A proposal was also presented to place functioning façade pipes next to the choir loft at a cost of \$18,000.00. Discussion was that we will research possible financial options before approving this project.

Old Business:

Dean is getting quotes to replace carpet in the sanctuary. He will get two quotes: one to replace the carpet from the foyer up to the sacristy room and laminate in the sacristy and the other quote to have laminate in the foyer and sacristy and carpet in all other areas.

Tim has removed Pastor Matt's name from the church sign at the road.

Dean has someone coming to place lit exit signs at the doors and install smoke detectors.

Financial audits will be Sunday, February 2. Libby Carrick, Herbert Frank, Kristal Ferguson and Kim Troutman did the audits last year and hopefully will be able to do them this year.

Security: We have 7 cameras located throughout and outside the church. It was discussed that we need to be sure someone is responsible for watching the monitor during the service and that doors are locked

Andy has written up the Letter of Agreement for Pastor Tallent to serve as our interim. The letter was presented

and Eddie made the motion, Lynn seconded and all accepted letter as read.

Our annual congregational meeting will be Sunday, February 23 and Pastor Tonnesen from the Synod office will be there to get us started with the call process.

There was some discussion about checking with the Synod office to see if Vicar Rob Crawford would be available to conduct services for us on the Sundays that Pastor Tallent is not here.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer
