Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The governor announced today that the current Phase 2 rules would stay in place until July 17. While we have not yet received directions from the Synod they said in the past they would follow the governor's directions on regathering. Phase 2 did allow for some outdoor gatherings but not indoor. Therefore, I anticipate that we will not be able to gather for inside worship until after the middle of July. If that changes, we will notify you through Google groups.

We will continue to use Facebook Live to offer worship for those who have access and will continue to provide the audio drives to those who participate in that program. In addition, thanks to a generous donation, we will be installing new equipment which should greatly improve the quality of our live streaming. That improvement will be particularly important because we plan to continue offering online services even after we are allowed to gather again indoors. We believe that will benefit our congregational life, and especially outreach into the community, as we look forward to calling a new pastor.

These are certainly troubled days in many ways and so much of what we hear in the news is upsetting. Sadly, our leaders in both political parties seem intent on dividing us and turning us against one another.

Remember that troubled times are part of living in a broken and sinful world. Jesus came into the world in troubled times to share God's love. The world, and even the Jews, were divided, as they lived under Roman rule. Among the people were those who tried to go along and those who advocated open rebellion and even violence. Jesus called a diverse group of people to follow him including a tax collector who worked for the Romans and a zealot who advocated fighting to throw out the Romans. Jesus turned those twelve diverse people into His disciples offering them a new way and a new vision of a better world in the present and in the age to come.

It seems to me that we, as Jesus' followers in this age, need to call people to a new hope and a new vision of a better future in which we find those things which unite us and encourage us to see a way of living in peace with one another despite our differences. It will not be easy and may lead to opposition and division as it did for Jesus, His disciples, and the early Christians who faced opposition from both the Jews and the Romans. But Christ is with us for the journey and the struggle against the virus and the violence.

Central to that journey is prayer, compassion, and kindness. Pray that the Holy Spirit may guide each of us, and all those in positions of power, to wisdom and understanding. Pray that we may have compassion in our hearts for those who are different from us and see the world differently. Pray that we may have the strength and will to treat others with kindness in the name of Jesus.


