Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This last month of the church year is quite busy. Starting with October 31, All Hallows' Eve (or Halloween as we call it) was the day Luther posted his 95 theses on the church door and so ignited the Reformation in 1517. We now celebrate it as Reformation Day in our Lutheran tradition. November first is observed as All Saint's Day when we remember our congregational brothers and sisters who died in the last year, as well as all of those who have gone before us. Our annual congregational meeting will be held on November 15th in a unique way required by the pandemic. Christ the King Sunday, the last Sunday of the church year, is the following week on November 22nd. Thanksgiving Day falls on the 26th and for many of us will be quite different from normal, also due to the pandemic. Finally, November 29th will begin a new church year as the First Sunday in Advent.

The beautiful and colorful season of autumn is upon us. Every fall I remember the old song *Autumn Leaves* by Nat King Cole. It was the theme song from a good movie about mental illness in 1956 which I saw once on late night TV many years after. While the song is rather melancholy, I always thought it appropriate for the season. It especially seems to fit in this year of 2020. I have heard lots of descriptive phrases about this year, most of which are not appropriate for a church newsletter!

The pandemic has certainly defined 2020. Dealing with it has been like riding a roller-coaster. For most people it is mild but for some extremely serious. And they do not know why in many cases. I recently read that there may also be as many deaths caused by the response as the virus. These include people who were unable to get or afraid to go in for treatment for various other health problems as well as increased deaths from overdoses and suicides due to isolation and inability to contact support systems. 2020 also had other troubles: multiple hurricanes and storms; wildfires; urban riots; and, sadly, incredibly divisive political campaigns intent on turning people against each other.

Amid all these troubles stands the Church of Jesus Christ. It has survived terrible plagues, famines, wars, heresies, divisions, persecution, and so much more over the last 2000 years. Despite the limits and frustrations we face, there are places in the world with challenges far worse. In North Korea, Communist China and many Islamic countries Christian face prison, violence, even death, for following Jesus. There are countries where the extreme poverty and lack of medical care make the pandemic even more dangerous than it is for us. While we are frustrated by empty shelves in our stores there are places where people are facing starvation because of the impact of the virus.

We who are blessed with the good news of our salvation in Christ are called to live in hope, courage, faith, and love, believing in God's mercy and grace. We can share that through our ministries despite the limits imposed by the Covid-19. Whether through prayer shawls, backpack food, support for GLAMA, Lutheran World Hunger, Lutheran Disaster Response, Lutheran Family Services, or any of the many other ways of helping. And never forget the importance of our offerings and the ministry of prayer for our congregation, our community, our nation, and our world. I look forward to the time we can gather again in worship and praise in our building. But we are the church, and our Christian life is not limited to our gathering but set free through our commitment and service.

Trust God, stay safe, live in hope, encourage one another!

September 16, 2020

Call to Order: President, Andy Ferguson with the following present: Lynn Dennis, Johnny Fritts, Marie Palmer, Chip Blower, Max Carrick, Eddie Heitman and Pastor Tallent, Tim Everhart and Judy Thomason.

Michael Willson, Lindsay Black and Sherry Proctor were unable to attend.

Devotions: Tim Everhart led us in devotions.

# Business Meeting Approval of Reports

Minutes of the August, 2020 meeting were read. Lynn moved to accept, Eddie seconded and motion passed. The Financial Report was presented. Max moved to accept, Lynn seconded and motion passed. The Treasurer Report was presented. Eddie moved to accept, Lynn seconded and motion passed. There was no Building Report.

### **Old Business**

Michael was able to get two filing cabinets for the Music Directors room. Andy will pick up and deliver to the church.

The organ repair supposedly has been completed but Judy discovered (while she was practicing during our meeting) that there are some keys not working. Spearman will be contacted.

Chip reported the Audio-video upgrade is roughly done. Continues to be a work in progress.

Andy reported that the work on the lights at the ballfield have been completed

### **New Business:**

We received notice that Donnie Parsons has resigned as the Chairman of the Recreation Committee. We discussed use of the ballfield for practice or games and agreed that the ballfield should not open until the church opens for services. A copy of the Rules and Regulations of the ballfield will be posted at the ballfield concession stand. Lynn made the motion, Eddie seconded and motion passed that we will not have a ball season this year but will try to resume in the Spring. We are in need of volunteers to mow and keep the ballfield in good shape. As council representative for the Recreation Committee, Chip will meet with the committee to reorganize and select a new chairman.



Andy reported that Lateffa and Kristal have been cleaning in the Fellowship Hall and Kitchen. There was evidence of mold in the Kitchen. Cleaning has been done and the thermostat will remain set to prevent further mold. There was also evidence of droppings in some of the cabinets in the Fellowship Hall. Chip will check to see if our Terminix contract covers treatment.

We received a request for a donation to the Eric West Family Dinner Fund. Andy will send out information to the Congregation if anyone would like to make a donation.

There is concern that our internet speed is not sufficient to carry our live stream when it is expanded. Chip assured we have what we need.

It was agreed that the unwanted items (chairs, dishes, vases, books, etc.) in the Fellowship Hall not be discarded until the church has been reopened for several weeks to give people the opportunity to take items they might like to have.

Someone has been putting their personal garbage in our church dumpster. The sides of the dumpster are locked but we will place a lock on the top to prevent this.

Action on the AT&T stock is tabled until our next meeting in order to locate the last statement.

New church signs have been put up. Thanks to Tim and Chip.

Chip will check into filing for non-profit organization sales tax refunds for the church.

Andy participated in a zoom meeting with the N. C. Synod and Council Presidents across the state. We are still trying to follow our State's guidelines for reopening. We are now in phase 2.5 which allows 25 persons at a public indoor gathering. Since it takes 7 to 10 people in the church on Sunday mornings to do our streaming service, that would only allow a very small number to attend. How do we make that decision as to who can come and who can't? Tim made the motion, Chip seconded and motion passed that we hold off opening until phase 3.

We also talked about how we can handle our required Congregational Meeting if the church has not reopened. We will have to vote on the budget and elect 4 new council members. We discussed sending all the information out by mail to our members and then have a drive-by voting. We will nail this down more as the time gets closer.

Next Meeting: October 12, 2020

There being no further business the meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Lynn made the motion and Eddie seconded to adjourn the meeting.
