Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Since we cannot have our regular Advent services, I wanted to talk about Advent this month. Advent is a time of arrival, the dictionary says, "a coming into place, view, or being." For Christians it refers to the coming of Christ into the world. Advent is the first "season" of a new church year. It is observed the four Sundays before Christmas and the liturgical color is either blue, for hope, or purple, for royalty. In our modern world it sometimes gets lost in the secular observance of Christmas which starts much earlier.

All around us we see and hear the sights and sounds of Christmas. However, our church calendar says that we should wait and watch and prepare. Advent is a time of waiting, hoping, and getting ready. Our lessons, music, and liturgy focus on Christ's three-fold coming: the coming of the baby Jesus at Christmas, Christ coming to us now in the Word and Sacrament, and Christ's ultimate return. While the secular world surrounds us with Christmas advertising, lights, decorations, and music the church is filled with reminders of the past - and of the eternal. Our Advent music is not just the sound of celebration but also of hope, remembrance, preparation, and witness.

Those visual cues and music make us appreciate that this life is fleeting and often filled with trials and even suffering. However, they help us remember that it is also filled with love, joy, and hope. It is filled with people who care about us as well as opportunities to share God's love with others. It is filled with constant reminders of God's grace and mercy. It is filled with eagerness, with youth who dream dreams of a better world, a world at peace. And it is filled with anticipation, with seniors who see visions of what might be, not only in this life but also in the next.

Terrible things can happen in this life: **pandemics certainly**, violent acts by unstable people, riots, illegal drugs, terrorism, war; but also hunger, racism, homelessness, poverty, and - yes - even newlyweds far from home with no place to stay and a baby on the way. During our life's journey, we are called to trust God, just as during that difficult journey long ago a couple trusted God in a time of confusion. They believed that God would fulfill the promise. Despite the evidence around them they had faith. Do we have that kind of faith? Are our lives guided by that faith or governed by fear? Do we have as much compassion as that innkeeper in a crowded town in hard times?

Like any expectant parents Mary and Joseph were filled with the anticipation of birth and were eager for it. But they had to wait, the time had to be completed. Mary and Joseph waited because the baby had to be born in Bethlehem to fulfill the promise and bring the blessing. We too must wait. We wait for a vaccine or results of medical tests; we wait to start radiation or chemo; we wait to get better; we wait to hear about our job; we wait for friends to come; we wait until we can get home to see our family; we may even wait for death. But within our life even the waiting may be a blessing. The blessing may be only that while waiting we have time to prepare. As we wait for test results, we have time to prepare for the news, good or bad. As we wait to heal, we have time to reflect on our lives and what is important. As we wait for our friends to come, we have time to prepare our home and a meal. As we wait to see our family, we have time to pack, to remember, and to plan. As we wait even for death, we have time to prepare our heart and to say goodbye.

What are you waiting for?

As hard as it sometimes is to wait, we need to be thankful God gives us time. Waiting, even for Christmas during a pandemic, is not a time for spiritual idleness but for working and watching. There is much to do as we wait. We need to recall the true meaning of the season. We need to witness to our faith as we share with others. We need to allow our spirits to heal from the sorrows and losses of life. We need to restore broken relationships. We need to remember that the church exists to serve Christ and others – there is no room for pettiness and self-centeredness. Our focus must be on the Great Commandment (love) and the Great Commission (evangelism). When winning and being in control become more important to us than Jesus, we stop being the church, or a family, or even a nation, and become something less.

Advent is a time to purify our hearts and nurture our faith so that we can fully welcome Christ. We need to prepare so that we are ready for the baby's birth, for Christ's presence in Word and Sacrament, for Christ's return, and for our own rebirth. We need to live out our hope and be led by the compassion that Jesus taught us. Jesus told the disciples, including me and you: "35 Therefore, keep awake—for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, 36 or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. 37 And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake."

Dear fellow members of Holly Grove,

We want to thank you for your continued support for the congregation financially and in our ministries despite the limitations in our worship and fellowship. It has been extremely difficult not to be able to gather and no one had any idea it would last this long. We are looking at options to try to increase the number of people who can participate in our worship, but it seems likely to be some time before things really return to normal. It is imperative that we call a new pastor as we plan for that.

We are excited with the progress we have made in the call process. The Call Committee unanimously recommended a candidate to the Council and we had good meeting with them. We look forward to arranging for the congregation to meet them as soon as we can work out the details. They are looking forward to meeting you. It has taken longer to get to this point than we had expected before the pandemic. And there are additional steps to complete of course but we are very hopeful.

This does mean however that we must be very aware of the need to support the congregation financially. There will be additional costs as we return to a full-time pastor and we need to meet our budget. As you know this has been a challenging year with several unexpected repairs. In addition, some of our members experienced financial difficulties with job loss or forced decreases in their businesses. Despite that we have managed to cover our expenses.

It is now urgent that we increase our giving in the coming weeks. To move forward we must be able to meet our budget. As your Council we are excited about the opportunities before us. To take advantage of those opportunities requires that we all support the congregation with our tithes and offerings as generously as possible. We know that may be challenging for you as it is for us. But we believe that together we can succeed in moving forward in the months ahead.
