

UPDATED SAFETY PROTOCOLS FOR OFFICE COMPLEX

In accordance with current state, synod, and CDC guidelines, the following protocols are required when entering the Office Complex.

- 1. Masks are required when in the Office Complex.
- 2. When entering the Office Complex, please wash or sanitize your hands.
- 3. Sign in at the side door with your name and the time you enter and exit. This is necessary in the event that contact tracing needs to be done.

There is a table at the side door with hand sanitizer, masks, and a sign in sheet.

While the safest practice at this time is to refrain from gathering in-person, the strongest recommendation of the state, synod, and CDC is to refrain from in-person gatherings of more than 10 people indoors and 50 outdoors.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The past ten months have been challenging in many ways for us as individuals, as families, as a congregation, and as a country. The uncertainty and stressors we have and continue to experience have affected our hearts, minds, and bodies.

Mental illnesses affect 19% of the adult population, 46% of teenagers, and 13% of children each year. However, only half of those affected receive treatment, often because of the stigma attached to mental health, particularly in minority communities.

The ELCA has offered a faithful perspective and response to mental illness in a social message. "We recognize that the suffering of caregivers and families is profound," the social message reads. "Once mental illness has emerged, life will never be the same. The ELCA as a church commits to accompanying you as families and caregivers with honest, hopeful yet realistic, and prayerful companionship." If you are struggling with mental illness or with the challenges of this stressful time, please know you are not alone. God is with you and we, your church, are here for you. Feel free to reach out to me if you need to talk or if you need additional resources.

I offer to you below a litany I found that has been adapted from and patterned after Prayers of the People from the Book of Common Prayer by Rev. Colin Jones, Co-Pastor of Advent United Church of Christ in Columbus, Ohio.

Peace be with you, Pastor Anna Let us pray to the God of our Ancestors, who is the Creator or all Life.

Eternal Divine Spirit, we pray for the Church that you created through your Son, Jesus Christ; that it may provide extravagant welcome and serve those who live with a mental illness.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Guide us, the citizens and leaders of this land, this state, and this city that we may unite to provide for and protect the poor, the homeless, and those who suffer in mind, body, and spirit.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Forgive us as individuals and as a community, when we knowingly or unknowingly ridicule, look in disgust, neglect, or discriminate against those who are mentally ill.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Comfort and receive those who are troubled in mind and spirit. Bring them hope, peace, and the consolation of a loving community.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Grant patience and courage to the family and friends of those who are ill. Increase their perseverance as they face challenges to recovery for their loved one.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Protect and defend those living with mental illness from exploitation, addictions, and abuse.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Oh Lord, increase our awareness, compassion, and sensitivity so that we can embrace our brothers and sisters who wrestle with mental illness.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Because of their intense pain, and at times, their lack of perceived options, we commend to your mercy and defense all who are contemplating suicide today, right now. Bring someone or something to intervene.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

For the families who have lost a loved one to mental illness, bring them comfort in trusting that your grace accepts their loved one, despite the event that brought them into your loving arms.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Empower us to speak up for those who do not have a voice; save us from making peace with the injustices in the social systems that have failed people living with mental illness, especially our black and brown brothers and sisters.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Guide those who do research for the prevention and treatment of mental illnesses; uphold them with your compassion and diligence.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

We are living through unprecedented and stressful times. The past months have been tough, but we are in this together, and with your help we will continue to make it through one day at a time. Grant us all strength and peace to endure the pandemic, and guide us as we check in with our friends, family, neighbors, and fellow parishioners to offer encouragement and support.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Eternal Spirit of Love, we trust that in your time and way, you will dispel all confusion with your order and all fear with your peace. Through Jesus Christ, who reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
