Ingredients

- 2 cups graham cracker crumbs
- 3 cup melted butter
- 5 tablespoons sugar
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- 8 ounces cream cheese
- □ ¾ cup creamy peanut butter
- 2 cups confectioners' sugar
- 1 (3.4 ounce) instant wanilla pudding mix
- 1 (3.4 ounce) instant sechocolate pudding mix
- 3 cups milk
- 8 ounces Cool Whip
- 2 cups chopped peanut butter cups

Directions

- 1. For first layer/crust, combine graham cracker crumbs, butter and sugar and press into 9-by-13-inch pan.
- For second layer, whisk heavy whipping cream until soft peaks form. Combine whipped cream, cream cheese, peanut butter and confectioner's sugar. Spread over crust.
- 3. For third layer, combine pudding mixes and milk. Spread over second layer.
- Top with Cool Whip and garnish with chopped peanut butter cups. Refrigerate 2–3 hours before serving.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

It's one of my favorite times of the year—back-to-school. I love wandering the aisles of the store looking at new pens in different colors; fresh, unmarked notebooks; sharp, yellow pencils. With the beginning of the new school year comes fresh haircuts, new clothes, the promise of fall weather, new classes and challenges—it makes me giddy as the middle of August approaches each year. Although I am no longer a student, I am excited for those in our congregation who are—and all that this coming school year holds for them.

In Matthew 22, when asked to identify the greatest command in all the Torah (the first five books of the Bible), Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind" (v. 37). Jesus calls us to love God with all of our hearts, with all our souls, <u>and</u> with all of our minds.

Unfortunately, not only is the mind devalued within our culture, but also surprisingly within the church. We focus on loving God with our hearts and souls—and conveniently diminish or forget to love God with our minds. Jesus calls us to love God with *all* of who we are—our whole selves.

Loving God with our minds is not just a calling reserved for our younger disciples who are in school. Lifelong learning is the call of all of God's people. What does it mean to love God with all of your mind?

To begin, we value the lifelong learning of God's Word, the Bible. We are called to love God with our mind by daily reading Scripture, by participating in Sunday School, and Bible Study.

We are also called to love God with our minds by continually seeking understanding about the world we live in and those around us. Get curious and ask questions. Loving God with our minds is a lifelong journey of learning about the world that God so loves and all that it contains.

Whether or not we are returning to school, let us all commit to loving God with our minds. And if it helps, go buy yourself some colorful pens and a new notebook!

Old Business

The funds are available for the tune-up cost of the handbells which should be around \$750.00 and additional costs for any repairs.

Discussed options for use of the contribution from the O'Dell Black Estate. The leak at the bathroom has been fixed. There was discussion as to whether the water fountains should be put back up. Neil made the motion that the water fountains not be put back up and bottled water be in the refrigerator for anyone that has a need. Eddie seconded the motion and motion passed. Neil made the motion that Dean fix the wall back with easy access if further repairs need to be done and to fix it as he thinks best. Chip seconded and motion passed.

New Business:

Several property improvements around the church were suggested. The two mailboxes need to be replaced with one on a new post, the storage building at the picnic shelter needs to be cleaned/painted and there needs to be a new sign at the office complex.
