Dear Sisters and Brothers,

You can ask anyone that knows me and they will tell you that I LOVE autumn. It is my favorite time of the year. My heart and body are awakened by everything the season brings. My heart echoes this sentiment from Anne Shirley in <u>Anne of Green Gables</u>, "I'm so glad I live in a world where there are Octobers." I love the cooler temperatures, the changing colors of leaves and their crunching under my feet after they fall from the trees. I love pumpkins and scarves, apples and the crisp autumn air. George Eliot wrote, "Delicious autumn! My very soul is wedded to it, and if I was a bird, I would fly about the earth seeking successive autumns."

I have gone into several stores recently and they seem to have skipped over autumn and are already preparing for Christmas. Christmas items line the shelves...decorations, wrapping paper, artificial trees, etc. Advertising, both overt and subtle, is prompting us to begin our preparation for Christmas.

However, as followers of Christ, we live by a different calendar. Not only have we not journeyed through Advent yet, we—the church and Christians—are still in the season of Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time is the season in the church calendar that begins with Pentecost and leads us to Advent. The color for Ordinary Time is green, symbolizing growth. The gift of the Holy Spirit given at Pentecost guides us through this long season of growth in discipleship and service.

It won't be easy, but we can and must resist the strong temptation to rush to Christmas. We still have some work and some growing to do in Ordinary Time. When you are sitting in worship, notice the green paraments and vestments and let them remind you of the growth that God desires for us in every area of our lives. As we continue to journey through the book of Mark on Sunday mornings, notice the ways Jesus' life and words challenge and prompt us to live more faithfully.

I've heard it said that autumn is the southerner's reward for enduring summer. I could not agree more! May autumn also be a time for us to abide in God's love and God's Word and may they continue to transform us more deeply and fully into the likeness of Christ.
